**Eligibility Criteria for Post Graduate Admissions to various Programmes of School of Planning and Architecture, Bhopal**

Note : Condition of minimum marks as stated below will be considered as :

- For universities/institutes which provide marks or percentage marks as the criteria of depicting students' performance, institute will consider 60% marks as minimum qualifying marks.
- For universities/institutes which provide GPA/CGPA as the criteria of depicting students' performance, institute will consider 6.5 CGPA/GPA as minimum required qualification.
- Conversion of marks to CGPA or CGPA to marks will not be considered.
- For cases, where the marksheet/ transcript indicate both % marks and CGPA/ GPA, one is required to secure minimum 60% marks as well as 6.5 CGPA.

The remaining 40% (i.e. 10 seats) on the basis of the Institute's common admission process and SPA_DAT (Design Aptitude Test &amp; Interview) as per the above eligibility.</li> <li>3.
