Learning from Informal Settlements: Innovations, Issues and Values.

About the Issue

This SPANDREL issue aims to present the research and experiences of multidisciplinary professionals engaged in the study and development concerns of informal settlements. This issue welcomes contributions in the form of articles, case studies, book reviews and academic work from different disciplines, using different tools and techniques for identification, documentation and research in informal settlements.

An informal settlement is an assemblage of unnoticed innovations of taciturn dwellers. Material is scavenged, space is claimed, and the ingenuity of a self-builder takes the shape of a shelter. New units start to add on while the previous ones consolidate; resulting into a self-built network, a society, a settlement. The settlement keeps on evolving and patterns of configuration, territoriality, functions, and growth start to appear.

The terms squatter, slum and informal are often used interchangeably to identify, to categorize or to discuss this marginally understood and often externalized context. Although, issues such as overpopulation, poverty and unhealthy environment have been documented at length; discussions on unexplored potential of informal dwellers remain limited. Recognition of their skills and participation potential may unfold new possibilities for devising appropriate responses. However, a shift from status quo of traditional professionalism is required.

Admittedly, the education and practice of built environment professionals have been scarcely demonstrating skills and tools needed to observe, to document and to learn from this domain. The philosophy, as well as the education and practice patterns must be revisited to redefine the role and responsibility of academia, practitioners and policymakers.

The Journal theme “**Learning from Informal Settlements**” is to be explored via following sub themes:

- **Innovations:** Innovations by dwellers and the community. Innovations in education and practice of built environment professionals.
- **Real world Issues and challenges:** The gaps between actual needs of dwellers and the planned solutions. Challenges in addressing the development issues.
- **Societal values and systems:** Hidden power structure and agendas. Concept of social justice and social sustainability in defining the role and responsibility of academia, practitioners and policymakers.

Abstract or summary of the paper shall not be more than 200 words.

Body of Text: Arial 11 at Single spacing
All papers to be supported with references.
