These modifications will supersede the respective Regulations/ Clauses as contained in the Ordinance for Doctoral Programmes (Amended 2018). The rest of the Regulations/Clauses for which no modification have been made, will continue to remain in effect.

The Ordinances for Doctoral Programmes (amended) 2018 have been reviewed considering the Proposed UGC (minimum standards and procedures for award of M. Phil/PhD degrees) Regulations, 2019, which are now being re-circulated considering the implications of the New Education Policy, 2020. Some existing gaps in the existing Ordinances of SPA Bhopal observed during implementation have also been reviewed. The main points of modification are summarised.

The existing document (amended 2018) is proposed to be replaced with the Ordinance and Regulations for Doctoral Programmes (Amended) 2020 incorporating the proposed modifications and merging with the existing unchanged clauses.

The Ordinances and Regulations of the Doctoral Programme (Amended) 2020 shall be applicable from the academic session of August 2020 for all currently registered candidates. Any clauses of the Ordinance of 2018 applicable to specific cases shall be mentioned under relevant sections.

The Amendments in the Doctoral Ordinances in 2020 aim to broaden the scope to the PhD programmes offered by the Departments and act as a more enabling regulatory framework to foster a higher level of academic rigour and excellence by:

- Incorporating the objectives of the National Education Policy 2020 to further imbibe the spirit of flexibility and interdisciplinary research in the Doctoral Programme of SPA Bhopal.
- Incorporating relevant provisions of the Proposed UGC (minimum standards and procedures for award of M. Phil/PhD degrees) Regulations, 2019 and the existing regulations of 2016, aiming to raise the quality of doctoral research further at SPA Bhopal.
- Fostering inter institute Doctoral research through exchange programmes and research projects, adopting a credit exchange based curriculum supported by the Credit Transfer Policy 2020, of SPA Bhopal.
- Elaborating and modifying some clauses in the existing ordinances to incorporate academic requirements and conditions unaddressed earlier.

7. Departmental Research Committee (DRC) and Doctoral Advisory Committee (DAC)

The existing Ordinance for Doctoral Programme (Amended) 2018, has the provision of 3 committees:

- i. Departmental Research Committee (DRC) : for each Department
- ii. Scholar Research Review Committee (SRRC) : for each PhD scholar
- iii. Doctoral Advisory Committee (DAC): Institute level body

Since 2018, the DRC of each Department has been the only active body reviewing the Doctoral scholars' work periodically. The other two committees have not been constituted. While the SRRC as a format exists in some institutions and is a prevalent format, it has difficulties in operationalising due to concerns of maintaining parity of outcome and ensuring quality across candidates. The existence of both SRRC and DRC is usually not common.

This has been discussed at the institute level from 2018, and SRRC as a committee has been removed. The same is reflected in the proposed amended Ordinances and regulations 2020.

DRC: Term of DRC shall be 2 years. If the need for a specialist is felt in any case, who is not available in an existing DRC, a provision of a special invitee may be included, beyond the regular composition of the DRC, including past members of DRC.

The DAC is proposed to be retained. To be operationalised with immediate effect. Term of committee shall be 2 years. The DAC shall be headed by Senate Chairman with DRC Chairpersons of all DRC's, Dean A, Doctoral Programme Coordinator and two external members, nominated by Chairman, Senate.

Functions of DAC shall be as follows:

- i. DAC shall recommend amendments to the PhD Regulations from time to time.
- ii. DAC shall facilitate inter departmental coordination in conducting the PhD programme, including appointment of co-Advisors from across Departments.
- iii. DAC shall examine and facilitate change of Department if so requested by a PhD Scholar
- iv. DAC shall examine and facilitate cases of transfer of candidates to other institutes, if applied for. and selection of candidates for exchange programme based on the Credit Transfer Policy 2020.
- v. DAC shall constitute 2 member review committees along with Advisor/s to review the final Thesis Report Report before sending for external evaluation.
